

## 護照 / 簽證 / 旅行文件

1. 持用任何護照，須行程結束後六個月以上有效，且須保留足夠空白頁，以供出入境時蓋章。
2. 美國永久居民除護照外，須同時攜帶美國居留卡。
3. 隨身攜帶在美國的緊急聯絡人姓名、電話及地址。
4. 妥善保管旅行證件：護照、信用卡、現金和機票等，影印留底並與原件分開存放，或保存電子檔，需要時能迅速取得。
5. 出發前一刻，務必再檢查，確定證件齊全。
6. 不論持用何種護照，入境埃及均須有效簽證，簽證手續及費用由旅客自行負責。持有效美國護照，可於出發前及早至埃及官方網站 (<https://visa2egypt.gov.eg/eVisa/Home>) 申請觀光電子簽證 (E-Visa)；或入境時於機場取得 30 天單次觀光落地簽證，每人費用 \$25。持用其他護照者，有關簽證手續及費用等詳情，可查詢埃及領事館網站：

## 行李

1. 行李規定以所搭乘之航空公司為準，或會隨時調整，一切費用及責任概由旅客自行承擔，旅客行前應查詢所搭乘的航空公司網站。
2. 貴重物品及個人藥品應隨身攜帶，切勿置入托運行李中。
3. 旅遊巴士行李限制：由於巴士上存放行李的空間有限，規定每位旅客以帶托運行李一件和隨身行李一件為限。切勿攜帶超出限額的行李，以免因行李超件而被收取額外的費用。

## 醫療 / 保險 / 衛生

1. 本公司強烈建議出發前購買旅遊保險，以確保自身權益，安心旅遊。
2. 熟悉自身健康狀況、了解旅遊目的地，對旅遊而言是至關重要的。旅客行前應諮詢美國疾病控制和防治中心 (CDC)，可致電 800-232-4636，或上網查詢至埃及旅遊的疫苗及藥物的最新消息：<http://wwwnc.cdc.gov/travel>
3. 由於埃及沿海涼風及低濕度，感覺會比實際的溫度涼爽，應多喝水。

4. 出發前至少四至六星期，諮詢您的醫生，瞭解自身狀況，確定您已接種一般傳染病的疫苗，以及是否須要追加注射或服用疫苗。
5. 請將旅行期間所需足量的處方藥品放入隨身登機行李中，並確保藥瓶上有清楚的標籤說明。以便海關檢查。
6. 旅途中，付費使用洗手間，每人每次 20 埃及鎊。抵達後可與導遊兌換一些小額紙幣以便使用。

## 氣候

1. 出發前，查詢您旅遊期間埃及當地的天氣狀況：  
[www.weather.com](http://www.weather.com)
2. 埃及地跨非洲和中東地區，南與蘇丹交界，西與利比亞為鄰，東有以色列，南部的洛克索及亞斯旺被稱為「上埃及」，尼羅河由此北上經首都開羅，流向亞歷山大城，最後注入地中海。埃及大部份地區為乾燥、炎熱的沙漠型氣候，全年乾熱，早晚溫差大，風沙大，旅客須特別注意防日曬、防塵沙。5 - 10 月為夏季，最高溫度達 108°F；11 - 4 月為秋季，氣候宜人，最低溫度在 41°F 左右。

## 電器

埃及的電壓是 220 伏特，50Hz，插座是歐洲標準的雙圓形插頭。旅客宜自備國際旅行用的變壓器、萬用插頭，充電器等。

## 服裝 / 攜帶物品

1. 出發前幾天注意氣象報告，查詢當地的天氣狀況  
[www.weather.com](http://www.weather.com)，根據季節和氣候變化準備衣物。
2. 埃及是一個保守的伊斯蘭國家，以觀光業為主，遊覽首都開羅及其他城市，特別是在農村地方時，應該穿著較為保守的服裝。但遊覽沙漠或參觀金字塔時，可以穿著短褲、T 恤和舒適的休閒鞋。
3. 參觀清真寺或其他宗教場所時，應尊重當地文化，穿著能遮掩膝蓋及手肘的舒適休閒服。
4. 在酒店的游泳池或遊輪上，可穿著低領、無袖襯衣或短褲；在海灘度假勝地，則可隨意穿著舒適的休閒服。
5. 夏季時，遊覽車上、餐廳、酒店冷氣足，請攜帶輕便外套；埃及境內沙漠多，全年日照強，風沙大，宜攜帶口罩、防曬霜、太陽眼鏡、遮陽帽等，小心避開烈日照射。

## 入境機場 / 海關

1. 抵達開羅國際機場後，本公司當地英語代表將於機場內的移民出入境檢查站和海關前，舉牌「Peony Tours」恭候。

2. 旅客請佩戴名人假期 (Peony Tours) 提供的胸章，並使用行李吊牌標記您的托運行李。這些顏色鮮艷的行李吊牌和胸章將有助於快速辨識團員及行李。

## 語言

埃及的官方語言為阿拉伯語，但英語和法語也普遍通用。

## 時差

埃及當地時間較洛杉磯 (美西時間) 早 10 小時，紐約 (美東時間) 早 7 小時。

## 貨幣 / 信用卡

1. 埃及的貨幣是埃及磅 (Egyptian Pound)，簡稱埃磅 (EGP or LE)，進出埃及，不得攜帶超過 10,000 美元：  
1 EGP = 100 Piasters。紙幣發行面額為 1, 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200 Pounds；硬幣分為 5, 10, 20, 25, 50 Piasters 及 1 Pound。外國貨幣可於機場、酒店或銀行，按當天兌換率兌換。按 2026 年 1 月兌換匯率為：1 USD = 47.69 EGP。
2. 出發前應聯絡信用卡公司，通知您的旅行計劃並確認信用額度，以確保旅途中能順利使用信用卡。大都市的大型購物商店、餐廳、酒店、機場多接受一般信用卡 (Visa, MasterCard)；使用美金現金或信用卡均十分便利，旅行期間請帶足旅費，多準備當地小額鈔票或零錢，以方便使用。

## 餐飲

1. 團費中不包任何飲料，飲料由旅客自付。不要生飲自來水，建議購買瓶裝礦泉水飲用，並避免食用路邊攤。
2. 埃及穆斯林以牛、羊、雞肉為主食，禁食豬肉。

## 購物

1. 本公司導遊樂意協助旅客在旅途中的購物需求，然而任何有關貨物價格、品質或售後服務等，純屬旅客與商家之間，請旅客購買前仔細考量，購後自行負責。
2. 攜帶外國商品入境美國，請遵照美國海關規定。詳細信息，請諮詢美國海關和邊境保護網站：[www.cbp.gov](http://www.cbp.gov)

## 攝影 / 禮儀

1. 埃及是伊斯蘭國家，應注意尊重當地宗教和風俗習慣。
2. 進清真寺參觀，應保持安靜，女性不宜穿過於暴露的衣服，在公共場所避免擁抱等親密舉動。
3. 禁止在政府機關、軍事設施、博物館、畫廊、私人住宅等敏感場所攝影。在清真寺，拍照要事先徵得同意。除非您是在

拍攝一個擁擠的公共場所，否則，在拍當地人的照片時，應事先徵得他們的同意。

1. 埃及國際冠碼 00，國碼 20；美國國際冠碼 011，國碼 1。  
從埃及直撥回美國：00 + 1 + 區域號碼 + 電話號碼  
從美國直撥至埃及：011 + 20 + 區域號碼 + 電話號碼

3. 大部份酒店免費提供 Wi-Fi 服務。遊輪上雖然有免費 Wi-Fi，但航行中訊號不穩，僅能用於瀏覽電子郵件。

## 小費

團費不包括小費。名人假期建議以下小費標準，但絕非強制性，旅客可參酌實際情況適當增減：  
USD \$18 x 9 天 = \$162 每位。

## 其他注意事項

1. 出外旅遊首重安全，夜間或自由活動時，若須外出，請告知領隊，攜帶印有地址和電話的酒店名片，以防迷路，最好能相互留意，結伴同行，不單獨活動。
2. 住宿飯店時，請隨時將房門扣上安全鎖，以策安全。
3. 應隨時留意自己的行李，貴重物品請隨身攜帶或託放至飯店保險箱，切勿放置車上，小心扒手，多一分留意，少一分麻煩。
4. 搭乘美國國內班機，須至少兩小時前抵達機場，國際班機須至少三小時前抵達機場，以便從容通過機場安檢。任何緊急狀況，請立即與勵馳旅遊名人假期聯絡：

### **PASSPORT AND VISA**

1. Passports must be valid for at least 6 months behind the completion of your trip. Enough blank visa pages in valid passports are required for entry and exit stamps.
2. U.S. Resident Aliens need both passport and Alien Resident Card for re-entry to the United States.
3. Carry emergency contact person's name, address, and telephone number with you.
4. Safeguard all travel documents, including your passport, credit cards, cash, and airline tickets. Store copies separately from the originals or email them to yourself for easy digital access.
5. Be sure you have all the necessary documents and money before leaving for the airport.
6. Entry visa is required for all non-Egyptian passport holders and is the traveler's responsibility.
  - U.S. citizens can apply for an Egyptian E-visa at <http://visa2egypt.gov.eg/eVisa/Home> prior to departure; OR obtain a renewable single entry 30-day tourist visa upon arrival at the Egyptian airport for a 25 USD fee.

### **BAGGAGE**

1. Baggage regulations are subject to the operating airline and may change at any time; all costs and responsibility are borne by the traveler, who should check the airline's website before the trip.
2. DO NOT pack prescription medicine, valuables, and other personal necessities in checked luggage. Keep them in your carry-on bag.
3. Baggage allowance on coach: Peony Tours welcomes each passenger to bring one suitcase and one carry-on bag on coach. Due to the limited capacity for luggage storage on the vehicle, Peony Tours does not accept more than one suitcase per person in order to avoid any additional charges for excessive luggage.
4. Consult [www.tsa.gov](http://www.tsa.gov) for information on TSA approved locks and USA airport luggage restrictions.

### **HEALTH AND INSURANCE**

1. Travelers are strongly advised to purchase travel insurance prior to departure for their own protection.
2. It is important to familiarize yourself with any potential health issues or concerns related to your destination, and so we strongly recommend consulting the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) for up-to-date information on required and recommended vaccines and medications. Visit them online at [wwwnc.cdc.gov/travel](http://wwwnc.cdc.gov/travel) or call 800-232-4636.

3. Protect yourself from the sun, which can often feel cooler than it really is due to coastal breezes and low humidity. It is advisable to drink plenty of water when spending time outside during the day.
4. Plan to visit your doctor or local travel clinic at least 4-6 weeks before departure to allow time for vaccinations to take effect or to fill any prescriptions. Consult your doctor for suggestions on prevention and treatment.
5. Pack your prescription medicine in your carry-on luggage in sufficient quantity for the duration of the trip and ensure it is clearly labeled for easy inspection by Customs.
6. Restrooms in Egypt usually cost 20 Egyptian Pounds per person, per use. You can exchange small bills with your tour guide upon arrival for convenience.

### **WEATHER**

1. Use a website such as [www.weather.com](http://www.weather.com) to find average temperatures and rainfalls during your travel times.
2. Egypt lies at the crossroads of Africa and the Middle East, bordered by Sudan to the south, Libya to the west, and Israel to the east. The southern region encompassing Luxor and Aswan is known as "Upper Egypt", as the Nile flows north through the capital city of Cairo to the Mediterranean Sea near Alexandria. Throughout the country, days are typically warm or hot, while nights remain cool. Egypt has two distinct seasons: a mild winter from November to April and a hot summer from May to October. In coastal regions, temperatures range from a low of 41°F in winter to a high of 108°F in summer.

### **ELECTRICITY**

Egypt electrical current is 220V, 50Hz, and sockets take the standard continental European dual round-pronged plug. Travelers are advised to bring international converters and adapters for the trip.

### **CLOTHING AND THINGS TO BRING**

1. Use a website such as [www.weather.com](http://www.weather.com) to find average temperatures and rainfalls during your travel times.
2. Egypt is well accustomed to tourists; for sightseeing at popular attractions like the Pyramids or the main sites of Upper Egypt, shorts and T-shirts are perfectly acceptable. However, we recommend observing a more conservative dress code when walking in central Cairo, other major cities, and especially rural areas.
3. To respect the local culture, when visiting mosques or other religious sites, casual, comfortable clothing covering knees, and elbows is best.
4. Around the hotel pool or on a cruise, attire such as low necklines, sleeveless shirts, and shorts is perfectly acceptable. At beach resorts, feel free to dress in comfortable, casual clothing.
5. During the summer, bring a light jacket for strong indoor air conditioning. For Egypt's intense sun and desert sand, pack sunscreen, sunglasses, a hat, and a facemask for protection.

### ARRIVAL AIRPORT AND CUSTOMS

1. Upon arrival at Cairo International Airport, Peony Tours' local English-speaking tour manager will meet the group inside the terminal before Immigration and Customs, holding a distinctive "Peony Tours" sign.
2. Use Peony Tours' badge and luggage tag. These brightly colored markers help us identify you and your luggage quickly.

### LANGUAGE

Arabic is the official language of Egypt, English and French are widely understood and spoken.

### TIME DIFFERENTIALS

Egypt is 7 hours ahead of New York (EST), 10 hours ahead of Los Angeles and San Francisco (PST).

### CURRENCY AND CREDIT CARDS

1. The currency in Egypt is the Egyptian Pound (EGP or LE). You are limited to carrying no more than \$10,000 USD in or out of Egypt:  
1 EGP = 100 Piasters. Notes are 1, 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200 Pounds; coins include 5, 10, 20, 25, 50 Piasters and 1 Pound. Foreign currency can be exchanged at airports, hotels, or banks. (Exchange rate as of January 2026: 1 USD = 47.69 EGP).
2. Before your trip, contact your credit card company to notify them of your travel plans and confirm your credit limit. Most large stores, restaurants, hotels, and airports in major cities accept major credit cards (Visa, MasterCard). Both US cash and credit cards are convenient to use. Be sure to bring sufficient travel funds and have local small banknotes or change ready for convenience.

### FOOD AND DRINK

1. Tour fare does not include any drinks. During your stay in Egypt, it is advised to drink only bottled water and to avoid eating from street stalls.
2. Arabic food is the main type of food in Egypt. Muslims are prohibited from eating pork. Hotels generally have substitutes such as beef sausages and veal rashers on their menus.

### SHOPPING

1. Although the local guides will be happy to assist you with any shopping requirements, Peony Tours does not assume responsibility for any items purchased at shops while on tour. You are never required to purchase any items while on tour and must be responsible for your own purchases. Any after-sales correspondence must be between the passenger and the shop in question.
2. It is travelers' responsibility to observe US Customs restrictions when bringing in any goods from a tour. Consult the US Customs and Border Protection website at [www.cbp.gov](http://www.cbp.gov) for details.

### CULTURE AND PHOTOGRAPHY

1. Egypt is an Islamic country, and attention should be paid to respecting the local religion and customs.

2. When visiting a mosque, please remain quiet, and women should not wear overly revealing clothing. Avoid intimate gestures such as hugging in public places.
3. Photography is prohibited in sensitive locations such as government buildings, military facilities, museums, galleries, and private residences. When taking photos in a mosque, you must obtain permission beforehand. Unless you are photographing a crowded public area, you should ask for permission before taking pictures of local people.

3. Free Wi-Fi is provided in most hotels in Cairo. Free Wi-Fi is also available on board the Nile River cruise ship, but for email browsing purposes only.

### TIPPING

Please note that gratuities are not included in your tour cost. Tipping is customary in Egypt, and its purpose is to encourage and reward quality service. Our tour managers, local guides, drivers, hotel porters, and other service personnel do their utmost to make your trip smooth and pleasant. However, tips are NEVER mandatory. Peony Tours suggests \$18 USD x 9 days = \$162 per person.

### OTHER NOTES

1. Travelers' safety has always been our number one concern. For your safety, you should notify the tour guide ahead of time if you plan to go out at night or roam in your free time alone.
2. Always be cautious when staying at a hotel. Never allow strangers into your room.
3. Keep an eye on your personal belongings and valuables at all times.
4. To ensure your travel is as stress-free as possible, allow sufficient time for check-in, security screening, and boarding: 2 hours for U.S. domestic flights and 3 hours for international flights.
